

GENERAL RULES

STABLING – Stall charts will be posted on the bulletin board at the equestrian entrance and at the Concession Stand. We cannot accept telephone requests from exhibitors for stabling together. Include the request on all associated entry blanks.

CHANGES - Use the ADD/DROP form at the show office to make changes or additions to entries. Additions and scratches must be made at least one hour prior to the start of the session for which they apply. Entry fees will be refunded only for entries which are scratched prior to the appropriate session.

PADDOCK MASTER - Check in with the Paddock Master when you get to the paddock area.

HOLDS – Request in writing at the show office. Emergency holds may be given to the Paddock Master. Holds will be limited to two (2) minutes.

DOGS - Dogs will not be allowed on the show grounds unless restrained by a leash and under the control of the owner or responsible person at all times.

MOTORIZED VEHICLES INCLUDING MOTORIZED SCOOTERS -state law - Minors who do not have a valid drivers license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds.

PRIZE MONEY - Checks will be made payable to the Owner as shown on the entry blank. No checks will be mailed unless addresses are complete. Checks will be mailed no later than June 30, 2009.

WARNING – Under Georgia law, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for any injury to or the death of a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities, pursuant to Chapter 12 of Title 4 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated (effective 7/1/91).

COGGINS PAPERS – All horses must have with them current negative coggins certificate (12 months). This includes horses that are not entered but are stabled on the grounds. Coggins papers must be examined at the show office before exhibitor numbers will be distributed. They must also be available for State Licensed Representatives at any time.

ACADEMY GUIDELINES – A copy of the ASHAG Academy Guidelines can be obtained on the Web at www.ASHAG.org and at the show office.

HELMETS – Riders wearing protective headgear in any class will not be penalized.

HEADERS – All headers in Academy classes must be 16 years of age or older.

ATTENTION GETTING DEVICES – Attention getting devices and/or other noisemakers (including but not limited to tape measures, blow horns, altered bamboo poles, explosives, etc.) are not allowed in and around the make-up/schooling/warm-up and competition rings during scheduled competition sessions.

The Mid-Summer Classic Horse Show reserves the right to

- Vary or add to the names of those Officials who will be invited to participate
- Cancel or combine any class with less than four entries
- Decline or return any or all entries, return any money paid for stalls or entry fees before or during the show
- Change or vary the officials listed without notice prior to or during the show
- Require that only qualified persons shall be allowed in the ring during judging
- Make decisions that will be considered final

Exhibitors are hereby notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judge, horse show staff, volunteers, or officials on the part of the owner, rider, trainer, agent or groom will disqualify horse and/or rider and the owner shall forfeit his entries and all other fees.
